Mathematics

In Mathematics, students will explore a range of concepts including:

Number: Students are learning to recognise and use equivalent fractions, connect fractions with decimals and percentages, and order, add and subtract fractions with related denominators. They are also building fluency with multiplying by multiples of 10. Across all year levels, students are applying their learning through mathematical modelling to solve practical, real-world problems. Year 6 students will be creating a game using percentages and rational numbers.

Measurement: learn to work with units of measurements by converting between units and problem solving with area and perimeter of regular and irregular shapes.



Languages



In Darumbal Language lessons students will explore the 2026 NAIDOC theme '50 Years of Deadly' and learn about inspiring First Nations Australians in sport, music and dance.

Health

They are exploring Australia's multicultural identity by investigating the influence of diverse people and places. They are also discovering how sharing traditional foods and physical activities from different cultures strengthens community wellbeing and cultural understanding.



Digital Technology

Students are exploring how information systems support the needs of local communities and learning how different types of data are represented and used in digital systems.



English

This term, students are using a holiday destination as the focus for their persuasive writing and speaking. They are creating persuasive texts that encourage others to visit a chosen destination, using strong reasons, descriptive details and supporting evidence. Students will also present their opinions to an audience, building confidence in communicating ideas clearly and convincingly.
